Special congratulations to **3S Sea Otters** who achieved the highest attendance for the week with **98.89%**.

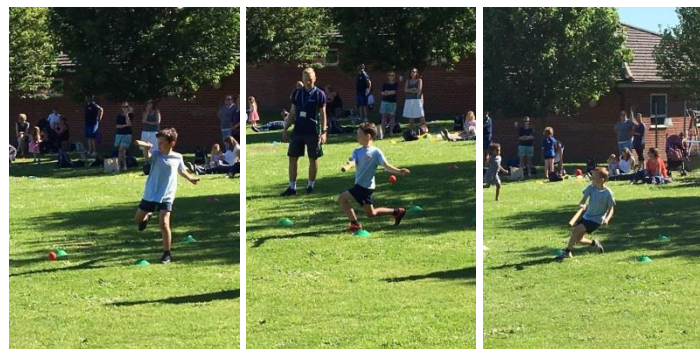
YEAR 2 SPECIAL AGENTS

Many of you who live in the village and the surrounding area will know a special little boy called Charlie Farragher. Charlie was diagnosed last year with cerebral palsy and cannot walk independently as a result.

Following on from successful surgery in the United States last year for his sister, Eliana, his parents are desperately trying to raise funds in order to offer Charlie the same chance this year. The total needed is £85,000.

We have decided as a community school that we should support Charlie and his family to raise some much needed funds for this surgery and will therefore be asking all pupils to take part in a 'Unity Walk' (in school grounds) on Friday 9 June. This won't be a sponsored event but donations will be asked for. The walk seemed particularly appropriate as it will hopefully be something Charlie will achieve once the surgery has taken place.
