

EYFS have thoroughly enjoyed our learning this term. Our theme of 'Flying High' enabled us to learn about different birds, from those we find in our gardens or around our school to birds of prey, particularly owls. We listened to and discussed different fiction and non-fiction texts to develop our ideas and as a starting point for our writing opportunities. It has been wonderful to see the children using their phonic knowledge to develop their sentence writing, as well as using the high frequency words displayed in the classroom. Our writing has included descriptive sentences, describing Mummy Owl, factual sentences about bird facts and speech bubbles for the baby owls. It has also been wonderful to see the children writing during child initiated learning - writing shopping lists in the role play and labels to describe models they have made.

Our bird learning has provided some fantastic art opportunities. We used pastels to draw garden birds and owls, blending the colours using our fingers. We also created collage owls, tearing different shades and types of paper to represent feathers and used sponges to show the fluffy owlets.

To complete our learning on birds, we took part in the RSPB garden bird watch as part of our home learning. We then used the information collected by the children to find out which was our most common bird during our . We added each total and used ten -frames to make our results easier to read.

In addition to our class learning, we have also participated in the whole school well-being week and internet safety day. During well-being week, we played the whisper game, passing a whisper around the circle to demonstrate the importance of listening to each other. We then talked about things which are important to us. We noticed all these things made us feel happy and safe which is important for our well-being. We learnt an easy breathing technique to calm ourselves called 5-finger breathing. For internet safety day, we discussed the many different ways we use technology in the home, school and all around us. We then discussed how these sometimes help us, for example computers and phones and many are fun, such as ipads and games consoles. We then sorted different images of types of technology through time. The children did not recognise many of

the items such as record players! We finished our learning by reading the story 'Chicken Clicking' - a story about staying safe online.

It has been a fantastic term and the children have worked hard. I would like to wish everyone a happy and restful half term and I look forward to seeing you at the start of term 4.




















#### KS1

The children have impressed us with their ability to include all the key vocabulary and main ideas that we have researched during our lessons.


During our Well-Being Week the children enjoyed listening to the story of 'The Boy, the horse, the fox and the mole.' We thought about the qualities that make us special and unique.

It's been brilliant to see the children enjoying our library and finding books that might help them in this endeavour, especially as we've had a real focus on the importance of reading this term in school. Our focus on wellbeing during Wellbeing Week this term was a highlight, and I've loved seeing putting this into practice both in the classroom and on the playground, and working hard to earn team Pride Points in every aspect of school life. Our focus on being creative was centre in our school focus on gymnastics where children experimented with different body shapes, creating routines with balances, rotations, shapes, and flight. It was wonderful to see the children using the large apparatus including wall bars whilst showcasing their learning.

Speaking to the children, they've loved their Science learning too, with immersive investigations in every year group, investigating magnetic forces in Year 3. Meanwhile Year 5 investigated materials and their uses as thermal insulators, and Year 4 explored creating electrical circuits and static electricity. The children have shown so much creative talent this year as future artists, designers and engineers through their art and DT days. This term, Year 6 turned their hand to designing and building their own moving toys using Cams in DT. Meanwhile, year 3 created their own magnetic board games, carefully thinking about how they could make their games both fun and long lasting. Year 4 enjoyed observational drawing, looking at patterns and colour.

Everyone across the phase has worked incredibly hard this term and demonstrated our PRIDE values. I can't wait to welcome all of the children back in the new term, after a restful break for us all.
