English

Jemmy Button

We will be exploring the true story of Jemmy Button, a boy taken from his homeland and brought to England. We will focus on:

Understanding the character of Jemmy Button and how he is feeling at different stages throughout the story.

Re-telling the narrative in our own words.

Using proper nouns correctly.

Using prepositions of time, place and movement to accurately describe where, when and how events occur throughout the story.

Using adverbs of time, place and manner to provide more detail to events in the story.
