At Staplehurst School we are determined to develop knowledge across all subject areas, including PE. We offer a broad range of sporting experiences that provide opportunities to develop creativity, resilience and character. We teach children to ensure that all pupils develop the fundamental skills

### Pennies for the Ukraine







This week the children have continued learning about Space, this week focusing on the planets. We have been using books and powerpoints to learn facts about each planet, as well as listening to planet songs during snack. Many of the children can now order the planets! During child initiated learning, we have continued to make space rockets using different materials, as well as space backpacks to take into space. We have also been writing our own planet fact booklets. It is wonderful to see so many children developing their independent sentence writing skills.

In maths this week we have revisited our earlier work on repeating patterns, this time attempting to continue, then devise our own more complex patterns focusing on shape or object, rather than colour. The children developed some imaginative patterns during our group tasks.









## Year 1











Year 1 had a fun PE lesson learning how to do a chest pass. They practised sitting on the floor before moving to doing it standing up. It was lovely to physically active in the fresh spring sunshine.

#### Year 2



This week Year 2 enjoyed learning about the life of Florence Nightingale and the impact she had on modern medicine. The PTA funded workshop saw Florence join the children, recreate the her journey to Crimea and describe what happened when she was there. The children asked brilliant questions and shared their prior knowledge too! What a wonderful workshop, a real highlight of the week!















This week Year 3 learnt all about colour mixing, we had lots of fun creating colours that would have been used in the Stone Age to create cave art. We mixed a range of different colours, and found out that adding white lightens a colour, adding black darkens a colour and adding blue makes a colour a lot deeper.

This term, Year 4 are studying dance by creating short sequences of movements. They put together jumps, balances, twists and steps and thought about how they could begin and end their sequence. Using great team work and communication skills they have produced some great routines!

In Science Year 4 are studying sound and have recently learnt more about pitch and amplitude. By playing various musical instruments they understood how to make the pitch of a sound higher or lower.
















On Tuesday this week, Year 5 had an anti-racism workshop with Zara Rawlinson from Panda Anti Racism Team. The children learnt about the meanings of words such as diversity, inclusivity, stereotype, equality, equity, and ally. They enjoyed taking part in an activity designed to challenge stereotypes by having to guess what a person is like from their image. We had an excellent discussion about the importance of the 5D's (document, distract, delay, delegate, direct) and what we would do in certain circumstances if we witnessed a racist incident. The children asked some well-constructed and thought-provoking questions around the topic of racism. The children really engaged with the topic and were still discussing it at the end of the day! This week our Year 6s started a new unit in maths: Algebra!

They have been investigating function machines, using formulae and finding unknowns in equations.


