### A Letter from Our Chair of Governors



Dear Parents and Carers,

The last two terms have been memorable for us all. The school has coped magnificently with the strains of the Covid pandemic, but as we all know, we in Staplehurst and the rest of the UK are not "out of the woods" yet. Covid continues to put huge strains on school life, with absences of staff and children generating large quantities of extra work and strain for all of us involved in the life of our school.

And yet, in January we received the long-awaited call from OFSTED and the school was inspected for two intense days by a team of three inspectors on January 25th and 26th.

The outcome of the inspection is now well known to you all. Our School was found by the inspection team to be "Good" in every category. The report for example, notes that :-

'Leaders have brought about much needed change. They have raised standards in all areas.'

'Leaders want pupils to receive an excellent education. This vision is understood by staff and executed with much determination and passion.'

'The school is highly inclusive."

'There is a culture of care and vigilance at the school.'

'Parents and carers recognise the many improvements.'

I could of course fill this letter with more quotations, but I wanted to emphasise how proud we are that the outstanding work done by all of the staff, ably led by Miss Davenport, has been duly

recognized by OFSTED and put on record. We note too that the section **What does the school need to improve?** could be summarised as "Carry on doing what you are doing."

This is a terrific outcome for the school. The report indicates that the pace and momentum of change has not slackened in the school despite the impact of Covid and the complete closures that have been experienced in the last two years. I think this is a quite outstanding compliment to the school – because we all know just how much effort every school has had to make over the last two years just to keep the education of our children going at all. Yet here at Staplehurst, we have coupled this with real and recognisable school improvement implemented in the teeth of the Pandemic storm.

The Governing Body is so proud of our lovely school, and I know that our pride is shared by our Headteacher, her staff, our parents and carers and our wider community. Thank you all for choosing to send your children to Staplehurst School, and thanks too for all you do to support its work.

I know our staff are going to have an extremely well earned rest over Easter and I hope you and your families enjoy a peaceful and happy holiday too.

#### **Curriculum: Mr Williams - Jones**

Pupils study a broad range of subjects. The school's curriculum, including in early years, has been carefully considered in reading and mathematics, as well as in history and geography. In these subjects, leaders have thought about the knowledge they want pupils to learn and the order in which it should be taught. Pupils impressively demonstrate the knowledge that they have learned and remembered in their written work. Leaders have plans in place to apply similar thinking to other subjects, such as art and religious education. They have taken a measured approach to getting this work done.

We have had another fantastic term and our curriculum continues to move from strength to strength. This work has been acknowledged in our recent OFSTED inspection. This is a validation of the hard work from our children and also staff, to demonstrate excellent learning. The children are now writing so confidently about what they are learning in History and Geograp hy; it is a pleasure to see and discuss with them. Work is continuing to take our excellent curriculum even further, with enrichment opportunities. Many classes have already been out on trips this year, deepening their

knowledge of the subjects they are studying, with more lined up for the summer term. This continues to offer our children the very best opportunities to understand more.





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
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# Key Stage 1 Phase Leader: Mr Smith

## **EYFS Phase Leader: Mrs Golding**

It has been a wonderful term of learning and new experiences in EYFS this term. The children have all continued to work hard, demonstrating our school PRIDE values and growing in confidence. As Phase leader I am lucky to have the opportunity to welcome visitors, such as prospective parents or colleagues from our own and other schools. It is always a pleasure to share our learning and our environment with visitors. Visitors have commented on the children's learning behaviours and their positive behaviour.

There have been many highlights this term. The children have enjoyed learning about and celebrating different special occasions, cooking for the first time for pancake day and making cards for Mother's Day and Easter. In EYFS we love sharing books and listening to stories and as part of our celebration of reading week it was lovely to welcome older children from our school to read with the children. We also enjoyed meeting the author Ian MacDonald. The children thoroughly enjoyed his story and asked excellent questions about the illustrations and how he thinks of his ideas for his stories. We were particularly proud of our children when each class visited Staplehurst library. They all represented our school wonderfully both on the walk to the library and once we arrived, meeting staff and learning how the library works. They were thrilled to be able to borrow books to take back to school.

The children have thoroughly enjoyed this term's learning all about space and we have received so many positive comments from parents about how much the children have learnt. Our focus this term is the development of the children's writing and it has been lovely to see so many children writing for different purposes, such as making labels for the rockets they have built and writing their own solar system information books. We have also been developing other skills such as cutting when making Kandinsky inspired planet circle pictures and using plasticine to represent the solar system.

The most recent highlight of this term has to be the 'Astro Dome'. The children had a fantastic morning firstly looking at actual rocks from space, before entering the dome for a wonderful show. We looked at the different star constellations and how to find them in the night sky as well as visiting the Moon and Mars! The owner of the dome, Peter was amazed by how much the children knew and by the questions they asked at the end of the experience. We received an email following the visit praising the children's knowledge and how well behaved and enthusiastic they children were. The experience was funded by our school PTA and we would like to thank them for giving our children this opportunity, they had a wonderful time. The morning ended with space food tasting,

again funded by the PTA. There were mixed responses to the food, particularly the space ice cream! The space fruit was much more popular!

We continue to be proud of the children in EYFS and we look forward to welcoming them back for another exciting term after the Easter break. We would also like to thank parents for their support throughout the term.

# Key Stage 2

As we approach the close of another term, I've thoroughly enjoyed speaking to the children and staff in KS2 this week about their personal highlights. Seeing the effort and enthusiasm the children have shown in their learning makes me so proud, and the fantastic range of learning activities they have experienced this term is incredible; every child has enjoyed a broad variety of opportunities, engaging topics and captivating workshops.

This week I asked children to share their favourite topics from this term with me, and I enjoyed having conversations about Civil Rights, the Rainforest and Stone Age – it's clear that they've really enjoyed their knowledge rich learning and were able to talk in depth about what they had discovered. Speaking to the children, they've loved their Science learning too, with immersive investigations in every year group, children in year four have loved learning about sound, and our year fives were especially lucky to receive a visit from Cornwallis Academy who worked with them to investigate how different solutions change between solids, liquids and gasses. It's been incredible to see the children so hands on, finding their own answers to life's big questions.

We've been lucky to receive visits from a range of different parts of our community this term. Upper Key Stage two enjoyed an anti-racism workshop run by Mrs Rawlinson, and Miss Pettifer has run art workshops for several year groups – our Year sixes have enjoyed today learning about the wartime work of Henry Moore and creating their own pieces inspired by his work and the ongoing crisis in Ukraine. The children have shown so much creative talent this year as future artists, designers and engineers – I've loved seeing work inspired by a range of artists, including Henri Rousseau, as well as by Stone Age art.

We've continued focusing on wellbeing this term, and I've loved seeing the children play with their new equipment on the playground, enjoying fantastic team games of football and perfecting their

skipping skills. Our focus on keeping strong and healthy has meant that lots of children have tried something new – from Street Dance to Curling, and I'm looking forward to taking Year 6 swimming next term. Everyone across the phase has worked incredibly hard this term and demonstrate d our PRIDE values. I can't wait to welcome all of the children back in the new term, after a restful Easter for us all.














# YEAR 5
