YEAR 1

To begin the new term, EYFS had to work out what they thought this term's learning would be. They quickly guessed using the clues that our focus was Goldilocks and the Three Bears. This will be the first of our Traditional Tales texts. This week we have enjoyed sharing different versions of the story and we are beginning to identify similarities and differences. The children are all enjoying joining in with the repeated phrases in the story and it has been wonderful to see some of the children using the story language to retell the story using masks and props during our continuous provision.

In maths this week we have begun to explore numbers beyond 10. We have been counting and developing our understanding of numbers to 20, making different amounts using Numicon, tens frames and cube towers, as well as recognising the numerals. We continued this during continuous provision, even going beyond 20 using the Numicon!

Year 1




Year 1 have started their new science unit on 'Seasons'. The children which seasons were warm, and which were cold. They painted trees to show each of the different seasons.














Year 2



This week Year 2 have begun an exciting new topic in Science: Food chains and Life cycles. We learnt that the most important source of energy in our world is the Sun, and discovered how that energy is transferred from one living thing to another through a food chain. We discussed how plants can make their own food using the energy from the sun, and so we all them producers, but that most

animals need to eat food to gain energy and so we call them consumers. We briefly recapped what it means to be a carnivore, herbivore or omnivore and used this to work out the order of the living things in our food chains.

This week in P.E. Year 3 started their athletics unit in preparation for Sports Day. We began to think about the techniques we need in order to help us when running short distances. We completed

some relay races in teams, passing the baton and practising the skills and techniques we had discussed.





YEAR 4


This term Year 4 are continuing their learning on decimals in Maths. They used counters to investigate place value which then enabled them to write decimals with confidence.




YEAR 5

This term Year 5 have a lot of exciting science experiments to look forward to, regarding solids, liquids and gases. This week we were investigating at what point water becomes saturated when salt (a soluble material) is dissolved in it, forming a solution. We conducted our experiment by measuring out one teaspoon of salt at a time, stirring it in to our beakers of water until it was fully dissolved, then repeating this process until the salt would not dissolve any more. This showed us that the solution had reached saturation.














This week Year 6 ventured to Weald Sports Centre to take part in their first swimming lesson of the term.
