

# YEAR 1

This week EYFS have been enjoying the story of the Three Little Pigs, comparing different versions, including one from the wolf's point of view! Our writing task was to make 'wanted' posters to find the wolf and some children made posters warning the wolf to stay a way from our cottage role play area. During continuous provision, we used different construction equipment to build houses, thinking about the different parts and their purpose. When using bricks we looked at brick patterns and tried to build using the same technique as we thought this would make our buildings stronger.

On Thursday we enjoyed a visit from Kent Fire and Rescue, learning that we should be testing our smoke alarms each week, how to call the fire brigade, what to shout if we saw a fire and what to do if our clothes caught fire. The children also got to see the protective clothing firefighters wear when they are called to an emergency.










#### Antarctica


Land

In Computing this week, we created art using iPads. We discovered how to create impressionist art using PurpleMash. Check out some of our work!


















# YEAR 3
























# YEAR 5


For our computing unit this term, Year 5 have been exploring how to use the 2Design and Make tool on Purple Mash. This involves editing nets and moving points to create 3D models. This week, we created designs for buildings, as well as creating our own, very colourful, vehicles! The children enjoyed seeing how changing elements of their design affected the nets, and being able to customise the models to create unique styles.













During History this week, Year 6 have been exploring the following key question: What was the impact of the Blitz on wartime Britain? Both classes carefully examined a range of different sources and explored the information they provided about the Blitz. Throughout the session the children considered bias and discussed how trustworthy each source was.

It has been wonderful to see the children so enthused by our WW2 topic and to hear of them completing their own additional research at home!





This week we are sending huge congratulations to Billy Wood - London Boxing Champion! What an achievement!



This week in year 6, the children have been learning about how light is reflected to enable us to see behind. The children modelled, using four different mirror activities including seeing an object on a table from below it (using the principles of how a periscope works), reading a message written on our backs and directing a beam of light to hit a target. The children then modelled the path the light took using ribbon before working on drawing scientific diagrams to demonstrate their learning.









A reminder that next week is SATs Week for Year 6. We will be running a SATs Breakfast on the Monday to Thursday of SATs Week for Year 6 pupils. Children in year 6 can arrive at 8:15am and be offered a complimentary breakfast of cereal, toast, pastries, fruit and juice.

#### Music





