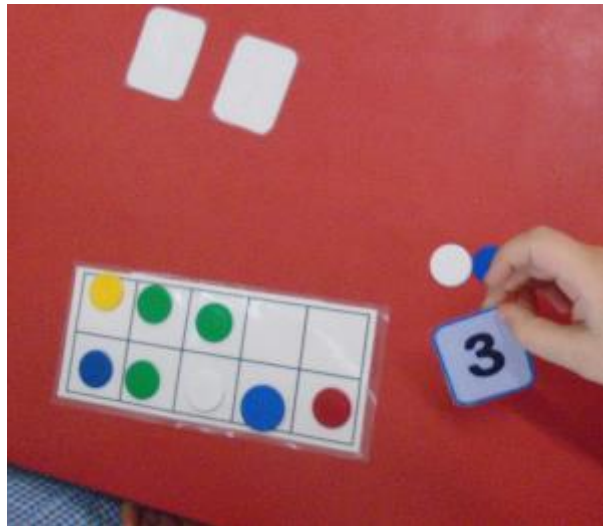
EYFS



YEAR 1

This week in maths EYFS have been adding and taking away. We have used different manipulatives, such as counters, cubes and Numicon to help us while working on our daily group activities. As well as using objects to add and take away we have also been developing our ability to verbalise our work, saying the addition and subtraction sentences we have made.

The children are really enjoying our work on traditional tales, this week focusing on Little Red Riding Hood. We looked at the two main characters in the story and thought of words to describe them. The children thought of some fabulous words such as criminal, suspicious, fierce and dangerous to describe the wolf and polite, brave and helpful for Little Red Riding Hood. During continuous provision, the children made baskets using different materials, including Lego as well as acting out the story using masks. We also continued work on the Three Little Pigs, conducting an experiment to see which materials the wind would blow away and why.







Year 1



Year 1 enjoyed touching and smelling pumpkins to make a bank of adjectives to help with their understanding of the story 'Pattan's Pumpkin' where Pattan hollows out a huge pumpkin and climbs inside! Pattan's Pumpkin is set in Kerala, India and links to our geography this term 'What are hot and cold places like?' where we have been learning that in hot places there can be deserts, savannah or rainforests.

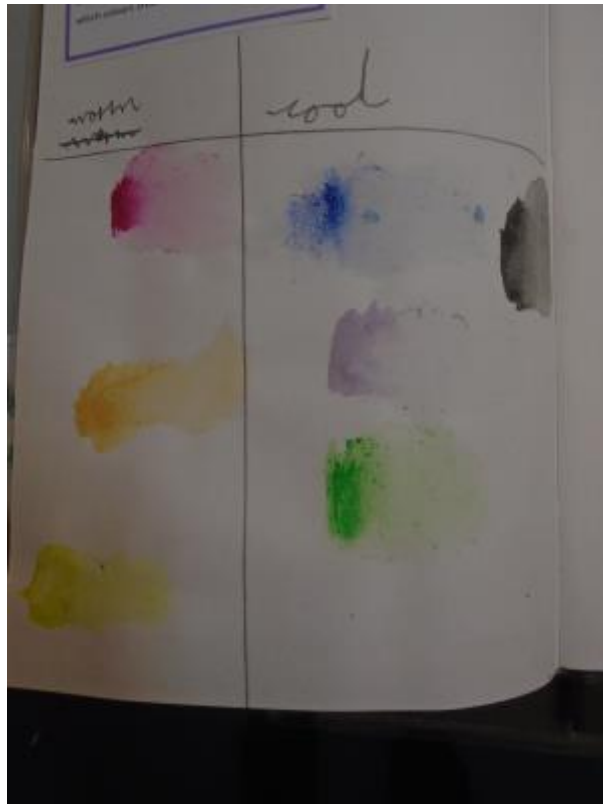


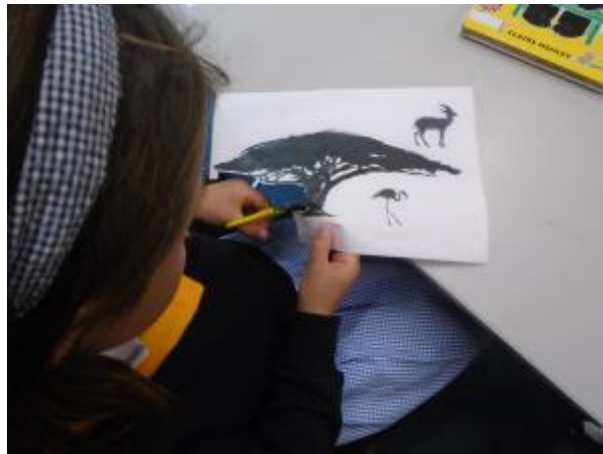


Year 2



For their Art, Year 2 have been exploring the use of watercolours. They have investigated cool tones and warm tones. Year 2 have also looked at how the amount of water used can create a darker or paler effect. They will be creating an African sunset scene so have also worked hard on practising their cutting skills. They have cut out silhouettes using small snips and learning how to move the paper around the scissors.
