

#### Pride Certificates Winners


Name	Class	Reason

#### Phase Leader update - Reading



#### Reading:

At Staplehurst we are passionate about ensuring that each child develops a life long love for reading to increase their knowledge and ability to read for pleasure. We urge you to encourage our children to read often and share the stories they have read with their friends and teachers and recommend excellent books so that others may desire to read these books as well.



EYFS have continued to enjoy our bird theme and we were pleased to see the birds have discovered and eaten the bird feeders we made last week. Our home learning task last week was to make bird feeders at home and the children shared some fantastic examples, using a variety of ideas. The children deserved the PRIDE points they received for completing and sharing their bird feeders.

This week we have enjoyed reading Owl Babies. We discussed how the owls in the story felt when Mummy Owl had left them and some children wrote the owls letters to reassure them that Mummy would return soon. They also drew the journey Mummy Owl took through the woods, labelling the things she would have seen on her journey.







This week in Year 1 during Science we have been testing whether objects are strong or weak. The children learnt how to control variables in an experiments. One of the variables we controlled was dropping a large rock from 10cm each time.













This week we have been working hard on publishing our non-chronological reports about hedgehogs. We took inspiration from our class text 'The Hodgeheg' by Dick King-Smith and researched about 5 different aspects of hedgehog life, including where they live, what they eat and what they like to do for fun. We were very surprised to discover that some hedgehogs like to climb trees and can even swim! We looked carefully at the features of non-chronological texts and considered where to place our title, sub-headings, text and illustrations. We are all very proud of the work we have produced.

### YEAR 3

This week Year 3 conducted an experiment to determine what causes an object to move faster or slower. We tested this by measuring how far a car would travel down a ramp, changing the surface to see if this had an affect. The surfaces we tested were: smooth, rough, foam and carpet, and we each predicted which surface we thought would make the car go fastest and which would slow the car down.












This week in Year 4 our children have continued their learning about electricity in science. They made simple circuits and investigated which materials are insulators and which are conductors. Working in groups, the children were able to identify the metallic objects allowed the electrons to flow around the circuit and allowed the light bulb to turn on.










In our History lesson this week, Year 5 went on an exciting adventure back in time, to Victorian London. Dr John Snow needed our help to solve the mystery behind the cholera epidemic sweeping Broad Street in 1854, so by studying a range of primary and secondary sources, we discovered that cholera is passed on through dirty water, and that the people who drank from a certain water pump were the ones getting sick!












This week year 6 were introduced to Watercolour painting. They explored mixing, blending and laying colours to create their own colour palette, and will build on these skills as part of their art day next week.












Year 6 have been learning about migration. This week they learned about economic migration and the impact the EU had on migration around Europe. They learned about the history of the EU and used at lases to identify which countries were members.







The Year 6 art club this week made mosaics. They really enjoyed using the tiles and grout to make interesting patterns.









#### Music



This week, 3S listened to another reggae track by Bob Marley, "Jamming," and answered lots of questions about the style, tempo, vocals and dynamics. We discussed the structure of a song and learnt what a musical "bridge" is. Then we accompanied "Three Little Birds" on the chime bars in 2 part harmony, keeping to the precise rhythm. Meanwhile, 3G had a ukulele lesson in which they learnt techniques for playing sounds like the rain and accompanied themselves singing "It's raining, it's pouring."
